### During the academic year 2025–2026:

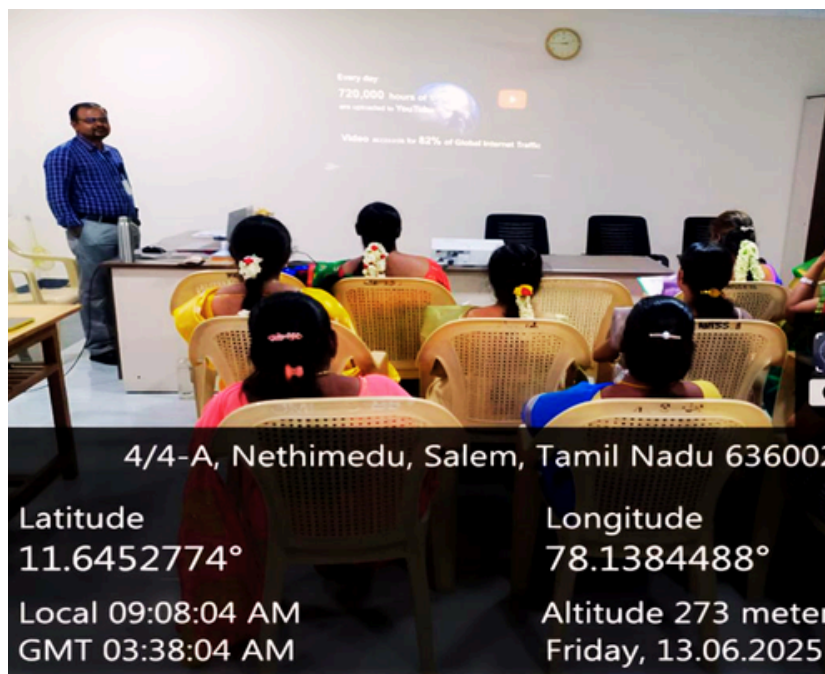

## Faculty Development

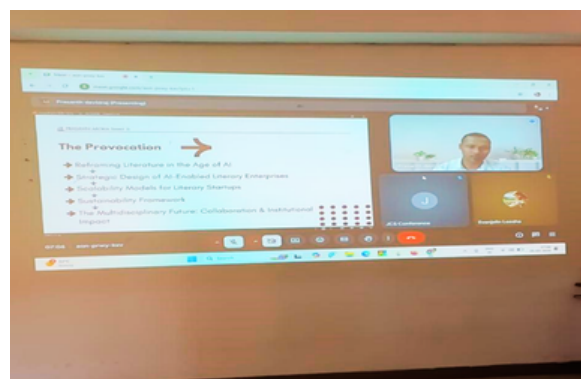

The 3<sup>rd</sup> B.Com students successfully completed a 15-day internship at the Periyar University Incubation Centre and Aavin – Tamil Nadu Cooperative Milk Producers Federation, Salem, gaining hands-on exposure to business operations, entrepreneurship development, financial management, and cooperative administration. The internship enabled students to understand real-time organizational functioning and industry practices.

Computer Science students underwent a 15-day internship in front-end development at LM Tech, Salem, where they enhanced their technical skills in web technologies, user interface design, and practical coding applications. This training strengthened their industry readiness and professional competence in the IT sector.

#### **Visit to LM Tech Software Solutions, Salem**

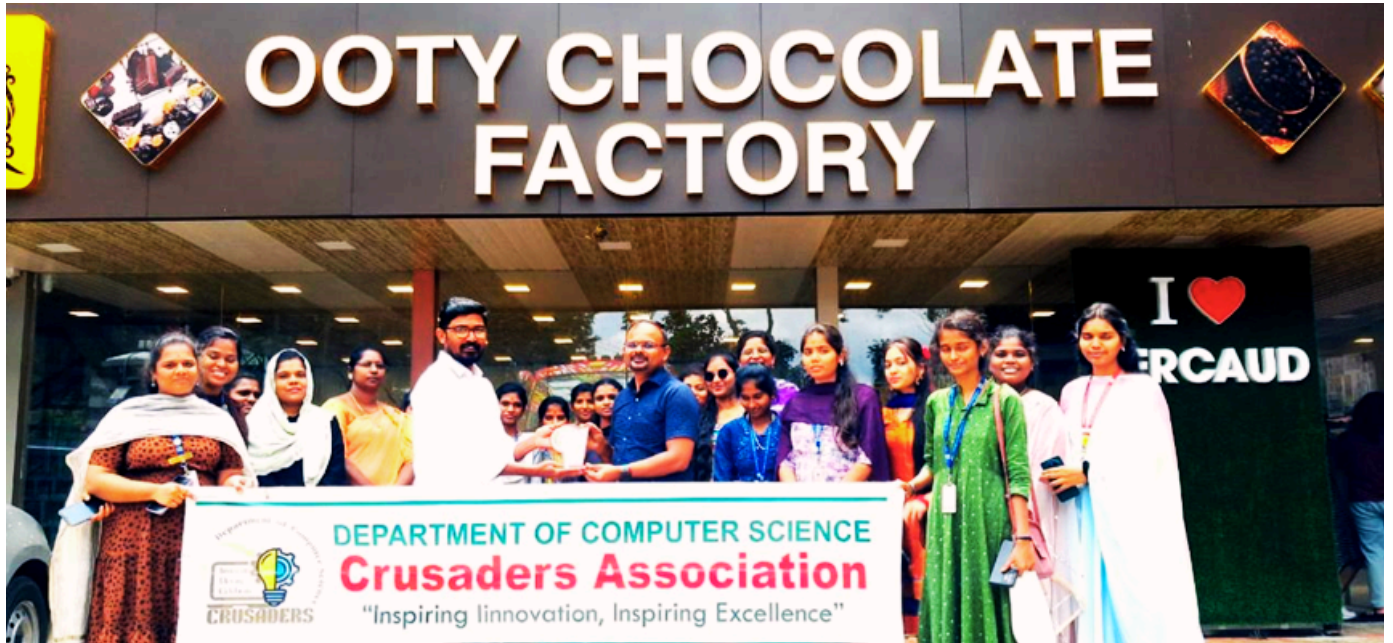


The 1<sup>st</sup> Year Computer Science students visited LM Tech Software Solutions to gain practical exposure to software development processes and IT industry practices.

## **Assessment Methods**

- The Examination Cell ensures a systematic, transparent, and continuous evaluation process in alignment with university norms and established academic standards.
- During the academic year 2025–2026, the College adopted a structured assessment framework comprising Internal Assessments and Model Examinations for both Odd and Even Semesters.

## **Internal Assessment System**

To monitor academic progress and enhance student performance, the institution conducted:

1. Internal Assessment Examination - I
2. Internal Assessment Examination - II

These examinations were conducted in both odd and even semesters as per the academic schedule. The internal assessments evaluated students' understanding of subject content, analytical ability, writing skills, and conceptual clarity.

In addition to written tests, internal evaluation included:

- Assignments and Case Studies
- Seminars and Presentations
- Quiz and MCQ-based Tests
- Practical Examinations (for Science and Computer-based courses)
- Attendance and Academic Participation

This continuous assessment model enabled faculty members to identify slow learners and advanced learners, thereby providing necessary academic support and remedial coaching.

## **Model Examinations**

Prior to the University End Semester Examinations, the College conducted Model Examinations for both semesters. These examinations were organized following the pattern and question structure prescribed by Periyar University.

The Model Examinations served to:

After each examination, answer scripts were evaluated promptly and discussed in class to provide constructive feedback. Parents were informed about student performance through mentors wherever necessary.

## Outreach Programmes
